There will be hands-on workshops all day, including one led by retired Ontario Herbalist Association Director Susan Elliotson, discussing "Boosting Immunity with Herbs". Learn about plants growing around us that strengthen our immune systems and help the body fight off viruses, bacteria and fungi. Sawmill Sid, who offers a portable sawmilling and wood repurposing services from will be sharing tips on Caring for the Urban Forest.

Also speaking is Dr. Phil Fung, an expert in nature-inspired regenerative buildings design, on The Importance of Wetlands in Backyards and Parks. Blooming Boulevards founder Jeanne McRight will lead the "Low Maintenance Boulevard Pollinator Gardens" workshop showing how to support pollinators by replacing high-maintenance turf with a drought-proof, salt resistant, no-mow native boulevard garden!

Mississauga Climate Action will lead children's gardening activities showing the basics of gardening and how much fun it can be! There will be food and drinks on-site, and many other exciting activities.
